The Free Range Egg Market

It is quite incredible to consider where the free range egg industry has travelled over the past 3 decades. From humble beginnings in 1980 our business was more of a cottage industry, with flocks comprising of a few hundred birds, and a free range egg on a retailer's shelf was hard to find. Organic growth over this time has led to the successful free range egg production system we deliver today.

Today flocks comprise of much larger units, in well-equipped state of the art housing, being legislated under the BEIC Lion Code, RSPCA Assured and DEFRA regulations.

The free range egg market accounts for over 50% of UK egg consumption and continues to be one of the most remarkable success stories in British agriculture in recent times.

Throughout our time in the industry we have seen periods of strong growth and demand. Similarly, we experienced a difficult time in 2011 through over supply, after many years of very high margins, which coincided with high feed prices, lower summer trading and a small decline in sales due to the UK's economic depression at the time. Fortunately, this difficult period was short lived, less than a full 14 month flock cycle.

Today the free range egg market is in a massively better position than it was during 2011, we are still experiencing year on year growth in the retail sector and we are still seeing expansion in the producer base. That said, it is still important that new entrants do their homework to ensure their business will be financially viable and, should they decide to go ahead, it's important to continue to monitor this on an ongoing basis; all of which Bowler Eggs can help with.

People enquiring about free range egg production frequently ask about gross margins (i.e.: margin over pullets and feed), the breakeven point and net profit which is very difficult to answer because everyone's financial situation is slightly different.

During our one-to-one introductory meetings we go to great lengths to discuss and explain all of the financial implications of running a profitable free range egg business and our team can readily organise cashflows/projections to identify what your personalised projected profit should be. Projections cannot always materialise into reality but it's amazing how accurate they often prove to be. If the sums still don't add up then we would strongly recommend you don't continue looking into free range egg production. For your piece of mind we only want to bring on producers for whom the financial side of the operation stacks up.

Planning Services

We work hand in hand with dedicated planning consultancies who specialise in managing all planning applications associated with free range egg production units and associated dwellings, which are submitted to Local Planning Authorities (LPAs) across the UK.

Our 40 years' experience in the Free Range Egg industry, is reflected in our success rate of obtaining full planning permission for over 97.5% of free range egg units on sites with planning applications submitted. Our success rate is also based upon our open and honest advice when reviewing a site, as not all locations are suitable for free range egg production.

As part of a planning application we can also help manage the preparation of specific reports often required by the LPA to support the application, examples of these are:

- SCAIL Modelling
- Ammonia Modelling
- Preliminary Ecological Appraisal
- Noise Assessment
- Odour Assessment

- Transport Statement
- Manure Management Plan
- Landscape & Visual Impact Assessment
- Landscaping / Planting Scheme
- Flood Risk Assessment

Ordinarily we would submit for full planning permission, however for sites which may be quite challenging, we are able to submit for an Outline Permission, followed by submission of a Reserved Matters Application, or we can speak to the LPA to discuss the principle of the development on a Pre-Application basis.

This staged type of approach has proven to be successful in gaining permission for free range egg production units within Areas of Outstanding Natural Beauty, Green Belts and Special Landscape Areas.

When planning permission has been granted by the LPA, normally the permission would be subject to planning conditions which must be satisfied prior to the construction of the free range unit. Again, we can handle the application to satisfy any planning conditions relating to the permission.
